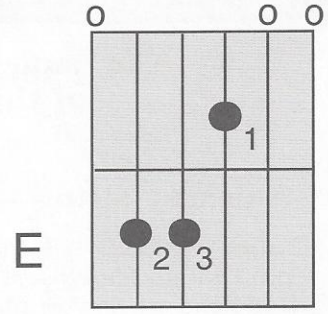
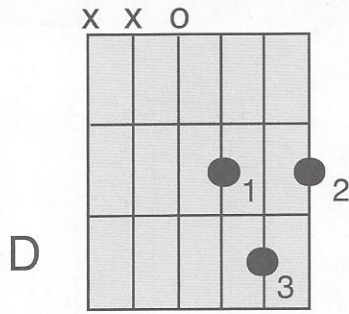
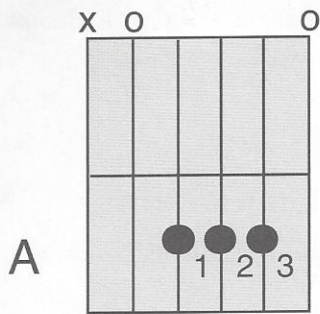


Major Chords

Practice the following chord combinations.

Play each pair of chords over & over, giving each chord just one strum. Work on quick, smooth switching from one chord to another.



Reminder: This book uses repeat signs to indicate that something should be played over & over.

Practice the top halves of pages 2, 4, and 6 until you can switch quickly from one chord to another. Give just one strum before forming the next chord.

Don't strum chords repeatedly, as the act of quickly switching chords is your main focus. Use a metronome as a guide to pace your chord switches.
